Science has already conferred an immense boon on mankind by the growth of medicine. In the eighteenth century people expected most of their children to die before they were grown up. Improvement began at the beginning of the nineteenth century, chiefly owing to vaccination. In 1920 the infant mortality rate in England and Wales was 80 per thousand, in 1948 it was 34 per thousand. The general death rate in 1948 (10.8) was the lowest ever recorded up to that date. There

Is no obvious limit to the improvement of health that can be brought about by medicine. The sum of human suffering has also been much diminished by the discovery of anaesthetics.

The general diminution of lawlessness and crimes of violence would not have been possible without science. If you read eighteenth-century novels, you get a strange impression of London: unlighted streets, footpads and highwaymen, nothing that we should count as a police force, but, in a futile attempt to compensate for all this, an abominably savage and ferocious law. Street-lighting, telephones, finger-printing, and the psychology of crime and punishment are scientific advances which have made it possible for the police to reduce crime below anything that the most Utopian philosopher of the 'Age of Reason' would have imagined possible.

a) Is it possible to preserve the lover and the poet without preserving the lunatic? In each of us, all three exist in varying degrees. Are they so bound up together that when the one is brought under control the others perish? I do not believe it. I believe there is in each of us a certain energy which must find vent in art, in passionate love, or in passionate hate, according to circumstances. Respectability, regularity, and routine -- the whole cast-iron discipline of a modern industrial society -- have atrophied the artistic impulse, and imprisoned love so that it can no longer be generous and free and creative, but must be either stuffy or furtive. Control has been applied to the very things which should be free, while envy, cruelty, and hate sprawl at large with the blessing of nearly the whole bench of Bishops.

Our instinctive apparatus consists of two parts -- the one tending to further our own life and that of our descendants, the other tending to thwart the lives of supposed rivals. The first includes the joy of life, and love, and art, which is psychologically an offshoot of love. The second includes competition, patriotism, and war. Conventional morality does everything to suppress the first and encourage the second. True morality would do the exact opposite. Our dealings with those whom we love may be safely left to instinct; it is our dealings with those whom we hate that ought to be brought under the dominion of reason.

OR

b) A total reverse of fortune, coming unawares upon a man who 'stood in high degree,' such was the tragic fact to the medieval mind. It appealed strongly to common human sympathy and pity; it startled also another feeling, that of fear. It frightened men and awed them. It made them feel that man is blind and helpless, the plaything of an inscrutable power, called by the name of Fortune or some other name -- a power which appears to smile on him for a little, and then on a sudden strikes him down in his pride.

Shakespeare's idea of the tragic fact is larger than this: idea and goes beyond it but it includes it, and it is worthwhile to observe the identity of the two in a certain point which is often ignored. Tragedy with Shakespeare is concerned always with persons of 'high degree'; often with kings or princes; if not, with leaders in the state like Coriolanus, Brutus, Antony; at the least, as in *Romeo and Juliet*, with members of great houses, whose quarrels are of public moment. There is a decided difference here between *Othello* and our three other tragedies, but it is not a difference of kind. *Othello* himself is no mere private person; he is the General of the Republic. At the beginning we see him in the Council Chamber of the Senate. The consciousness of his high position never leaves him. At the end, when he is determined to live no longer, he is as anxious as Hamlet not to be misjudged by the great world.

In a civilisation *without* faith, such as our own, everything tends to disintegrate and everybody tends to drift. That is one of the meanings of the most famous poem of Mr. Eliot's early period, The Waste Land, a poem about society, where his later poems, like Ash Wednesday and Four Quartets, are rather religious examinations of his own individual experience.

The awareness of living in a period of peculiar crisis is not...confined to writers with an elaborate, esoteric philosophy of history, like Yeats and Joyce, or with a definite and orthodox religious belief, like Mr. Eliot. In the 1930s many young English poets, like Mr. W.H. Auden, Mr. Stephen Spender, Mr. Cecil Day Lewis, and Mr. Louis MacNeice saw the crisis as acute but temporary, the result of a transition in society between a capitalistic and socialistic method of organizing production, and sought for a resolution of the crisis in political terms. Many, though not all, of these poets in the 1930s were veering towards Marxism, though, like Queen Gertrude with her rue, wore their Marxism 'with a difference'. The war, and recent political developments in the world, have tended to shatter these too rosy hopes, and in their recent poetry – Mr. Auden, for instance, who is now living the United States, has become an orthodox Anglican – these poets have tended to revert to more traditional attitudes.

Marlowe's gift to drama was his conception of the heroic tragedy built on a grand scale, with the three-fold unity of character, impression, and interest, instead of the artificial unities of time, place and action. Before his time tragedies were built either according to the loose style of the chronicle, or within the mechanical framework of the Senecan model; but in either case the dramatic unity attained by the Greeks was lacking. Marlowe and Shakespeare, with their disregard of the so-called classic rules, were in fact much nearer the spirit of Aeschylus and Sophocles than the slavish followers of the pseudo-classic schools. Marlowe painted gigantic ambitions, desires for impossible things, longings for a beauty beyond earthly conception, and sovereigns destroyed by the very powers which had raised them to their thrones. Tamburlaine, Faustus, Barabbas are the personifications of arrogance, ambition and greed. There is sometimes a touch of the extravagant or bombastic, or even of the puerile in his plays, for he had no sense of humor; nor had he the ability to portray a woman. He wrote no drama on the subject of love. Furthermore, his world is not altogether our world, but a remote field of the imagination. It has been remarked that "in Marlowe's superb verse there is very little to indicate that the writer had ever encountered any human beings." In spite of this, he was great, both as a dramatist and poet. His short life, the haste of his work, the irregularities of his habits -- these things combined to keep him from perfecting the creations of his imagination. Taken together, his plays imposed a standard upon all succeeding theatrical compositions. Before him, in England, there was no play of great importance; but after him, and based upon his work as a model, rose the greatest drama of English history.

An ideal of plainness is appropriate to an age in which men are learning to distrust the kind of language that appeals to the emotions rather than the reason, and of writings in which the personality of the author forces itself upon our attention: the history and politics of our time provide ample examples of the dangerous abuse of words.

Nevertheless plain writing does mean impersonal writing. Whether he is writing fiction, like D H Lawrence and E M Forster, or controversial essays, like Shaw and Orwell, the creative writer has an individual view of life, or vision, which he is above all anxious to communicate to us. Because of this, every original writer's style bears the unique impress of his personality: it is his distinctive voice. So that, when speaking of style, we should never forget the often quoted aphorism of de Buffon, *Le style est le homme meme*: 'Style is the man himself'. This statement contains more truth than anything one can say about the common factors of the prose of any particular period. The personal voice depends upon a multitude of factors: the writer's temperament, his intellectual or emotional attitude to his subject, his imagination or lack of it, his artistic ideals.

2. A swirling polar vortex is formed in the upper atmosphere over the South Pole during the long Antarctic winter (March - September). The swirling South Polar Antarctic vortex causes considerable lowering of the temperatures. The very small amount of water vapour present in the otherwise dry upper atmosphere freezes due to extremely low temperatures. This frozen water vapour forms what is known as Polar Stratospheric Clouds (PSCs). The South Polar Antarctic vortex is able to isolate or 'capture' CFCs and halons due to the swirling atmospheric circulation. The PSCs (ice crystals) convert the inert Chlorine and Bromine of the CFCs and halons into very reactive molecules. Return of sunlight in spring - summer releases the active Chlorine and Bromine molecules from their compounds. They disintegrate the Ozone (O_3) into ordinary Oxygen ($O_2 + O$).

a. There is maximum depletion of Ozone above Antarctica.

Romulus Whitaker, founder of the Madras Snake Park and the Madras Crocodile Bank, was probably the first person to draw public attention to the small and remote area. In 1983 the then Prime Minister of India, Indira Gandhi, decided to abandon the Project and on September 7, 1985 the Silent Valley National Park was formally inaugurated.

Numerous such ions come from agricultural fields which have been treated with insecticides, pesticides and chemical fertilizers; and from urban sewage effluents. Ions of phosphates and nitrates are rich nutrients to aquatic plants. In these aquatic ecosystems, there occurs an increased growth of aquatic plants, especially algae (algal

bloom). Such algal blooms on the surface prevent sunlight penetration and oxygen absorption necessary for aquatic life.

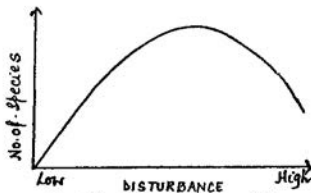

They move away from one another at a mid-ocean ridge; a long chain of sub-oceanic mountains that forms a boundary between plates. At a mid-ocean ridge, new lithosphere material in the form of a hot magma pushes up from the earth's interior. The injection of this new lithospheric material from below causes the phenomenon known as sea-floor spreading. 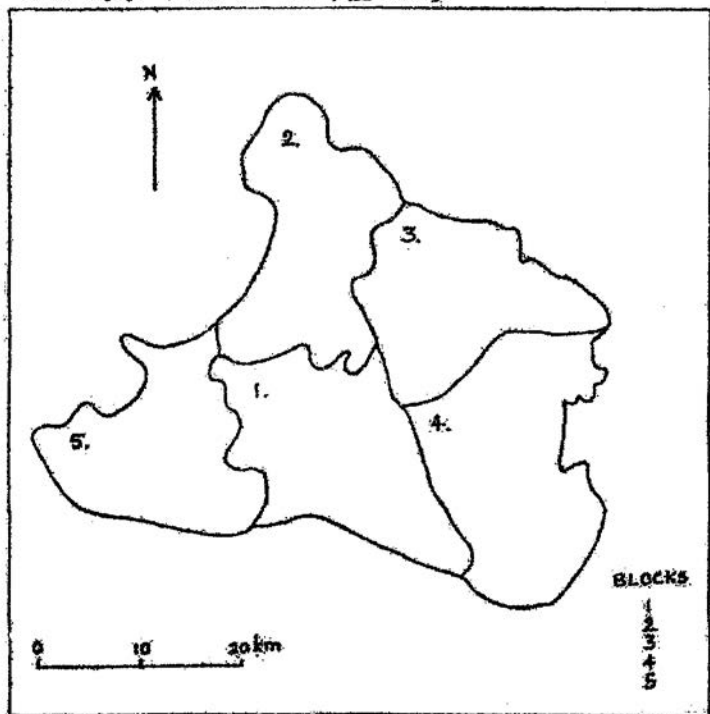

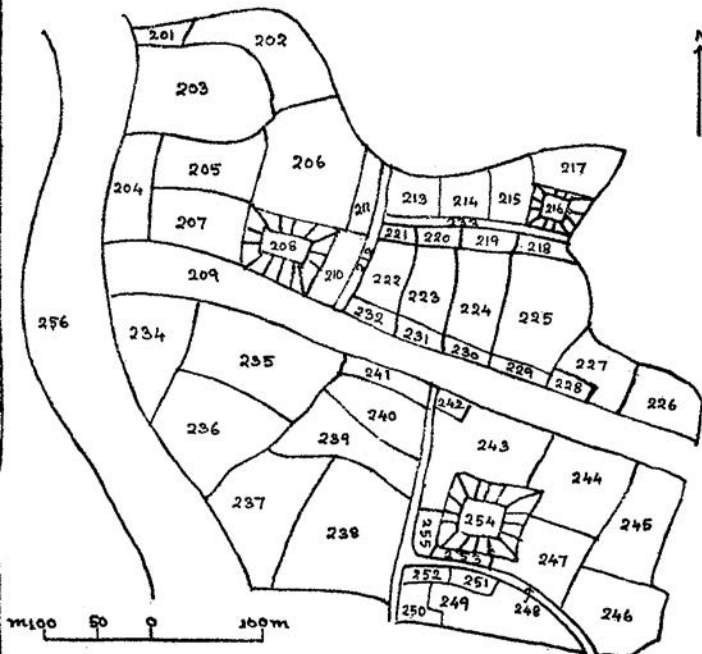

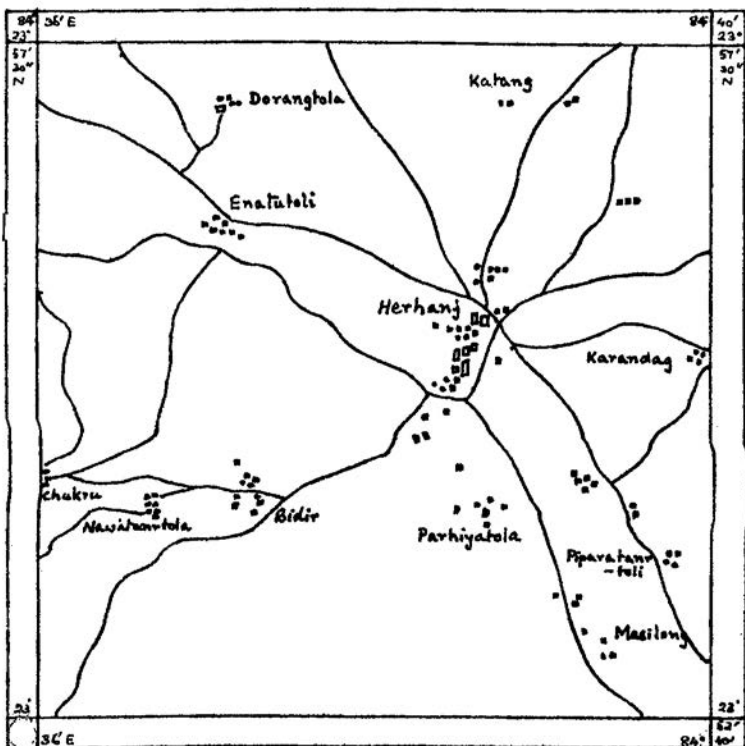
